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I believe that I have a very unique perspective on the value of Christian education, one that I have never seen effectively described in writing by anyone I know. As is obvious, Christian education teaches many critical values uncommon to secular education, and the essential spiritual characteristics, including salvation and protection from the satanic ideologies of public school teaching, are so self-evident that I imagine plenty has been written on that subject, and deservedly so. What I have yet to hear anyone articulate, but I have found fascinating for many years, is that Christian Biblical training causes a deep paradigm shift. Specifically, it is my observation that a disproportionate number of Christian school graduates develop entrepreneurial ventures at a rate uncommon to their public-school counterparts, and I have long thought about why that is. It is my conclusion that spiritual training causes one of the single most critical shifts in how Christians think, and that is the idea of self-motivated independence. I believe, from a business perspective, that the Bible teaches that we have a personal responsibility to take action for our own success and well-being, a spirit fully contrary to that of victimhood and dependency taught as a part of secular ideology. I believe this message is so deeply ingrained that many Christians do not want to experience the feelings of dependency that come from traditional employment; rather, their Christian worldview inspires them to strive to take care of themselves in a financial sense, which spurs their entrepreneurial capacity. Speaking from personal experience, I share this ideology. Though the majority of my own income is from traditional employment, I have many other minor streams of income that begin from that same desire to have something fully my own, not dependent upon a single employer's whims, in part because I believe God calls many of us to build our own business, to become a sort of "You, Incorporated" where we take full responsibility for ourselves. I can say with great confidence, as someone who transitioned from public to Christian education, that there is a very low chance I would have become motivated to explore as many entrepreneurial ventures as I do today had I not been a part of a Christian education culture, as the mindset taught in public education is highly to primarily excelling in employment alone.
